We have re-evaluated our plans for Wednesday, March 18th. In light of the most recent guidelines and mandates, and in the spirit of wanting to join others in slowing down the spread of the virus; we feel we need to take this step. Thank you for your understanding of our need to make these changes.

TOMORROW-WEDNESDAY, MARCH 18TH

- We will not be having school face to face
- School will be open from 10am-4:30pm for students (and parents too if you desire) to stop in anytime during that time frame to do the following:
 - grab material that we have put together for you
 - grab items from your locker-YOU WILL NEED YOUR LAPTOP!
 - touch base with teachers as needed
- **YOU MUST HAVE YOUR SCHOOL COMPUTER WITH YOU WHEN YOU COME! You will be using your Office 365 accounts! Do you know your password? Do you need your password reset?**
- Enter and EXIT through Door #17/main office entrance-located on the west end of the building. We will need to limit how many are in the building at one time. There is a good chance you may have to wait. Thanks in advance for your cooperation.
- MLHS begins shut-down mode at 5PM. This means no access for anyone except teachers & staff.

THURSDAY, MARCH 19th – April 6th

- Classes will be carried out “virtually/ONLINE” using your school laptops.
- You will follow the [Early Release Schedule](#). Be ready to go to “online school”. (1st hour begins at 7:54am).
- Your Online school is all set up at www.mlhslancers.org/online. This is where you need to go each day.
- Mr. Barthel put together a tutorial video that you will find at the bottom of the home page of www.mlhslancers.org/online.
- Attendance will be taken before each class. You must enter that!

- Chapel will be live streamed at 10:03 each day. Parents and others should feel free to join in!
